ARCC is working closely with local school districts to deliver Prevention Early Intervention (**PEI**) services in East and Central San Jose. These **PEI** services are targeting **high-risk youth** and their families with the goal of **preventing, reducing, and eliminating** mental health illness that may be inhibiting academic success and family wellness.



Having been born in **San Jose** and lived in many of the communities we serve at ARCC, I'm looking forward to the launch of the **Prevention Early Intervention** program. With families feeling the financial strain over the past few years, and the high rise of violence seen in our communities recently, these services will surely make a **positive impact**. 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years in community service organizations including 6 years with the City of San Jose and 11 years with the Silicon Valley Education Foundation. **I believe** in the contribution **PEI** will make to the community of San Jose.

Alum Rock Counseling Center will lead the PEI Service Program in the **Alum Rock, Franklin McKinley, Luther Burbank, Mount Pleasant, and Oak Grove School Districts.**

Understanding that partnerships foster stronger service provision, ARCC will work closely with **Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County** and **Grail Family Services** to address family needs. In all, 26 ARCC staff will reach more than **2100 students** and their families across **22 schools** in San Jose each year.

ARCC's team of **Family Partners, Behavior Specialists and Clinicians** will form partnerships with school site teachers and counselors, as well as other community based organizations to identify and engage families in need of support. Proven program services will include **family workshops, case management, resource linkages, behavioral support services, and individual and group therapy.** These services will be offered in the schools, out in the community and in family's homes.
